



Reciprocity Policy

The Office of Career Management (OCM) at Santa Clara University School of Law provides access to career development resources to current students of ABA-accredited law schools on the following basis:

1. Our policy is one of open reciprocity; however, we reserve the right to adjust the stated policy.
2. Requests will be considered for current students and alumni. Requests should be made in writing by the requesting career services office at least one week in advance of the intended visit.
3. Requests for reciprocity will be reviewed on an individual basis.
4. OCM offers reciprocity for the duration of three (3) months starting from the date that reciprocity is granted. Those granted reciprocity must pay a fee of \$50 (beginning July 1, 2015) for access to career development resources. This fee will be waived for schools via:
 - a. Northern California Consortium: Golden Gate University School of Law; University of the Pacific, Mc George School of Law; Stanford Law School; University of California Berkeley School of Law; University of California, Davis School of Law; University of California, Hastings College of the Law; and University of San Francisco School of Law.
 - b. Open Reciprocity: S.J. Quinney College of Law; Creighton University School of Law; Maurice A. Deane School of Law at Hofstra University; Loyola Law School; and Loyola University New Orleans College of Law.

One (1) month of free access will be given to those granted reciprocity from:

- c. George Washington University Law School; and University of Hawaii of Manoa William S. Richardson School of Law.
5. Reciprocity includes remote access to current job listings and career-related computer usage in the office.
6. If a student is requesting to visit SCU Law they must be granted reciprocity and must check in at the front desk prior to using career-related computer usage, provided by the OCM.
7. Services not available include:
 - a. Participation in on-campus interviews.
 - b. Individual career advising.
 - c. OCM on-and off-campus events.
8. OCM reserves the right to deny or terminate reciprocity with anyone whose conduct is deemed improper or inappropriate. This right is reserved in all cases and is solely at the discretion of the office.
